




FANNIN COUNTY GOP LINCOLN-REAGAN DINNER

2026 Scholarships

We are proud to announce expanded scholarship opportunities for 2026, reflecting our continued investment in the next generation of leaders. Graduating high school seniors who live in Fannin County or attend school here—whether public, private, or homeschool—are eligible to apply. This year, we will award three scholarships totaling \$3,000: one \$1,500 scholarship, one \$1,000 scholarship, and one \$500 scholarship. This represents three times what was initially offered last year and twice what was ultimately awarded, thanks to an exceptional pool of student applicants. 

The Fannin County and Texas State Republican Parties conduct their party primary elections and their precinct, county, and state conventions during even numbered years.

Republican Party conventions are a vital part of the grassroots process, giving voters a direct voice in shaping the future of the party. The Fannin County Republican Party will hold Precinct Conventions on March 7, followed by the County Convention on March 28, where participants elect delegates and advance resolutions to the next level. Both the precinct and county conventions will begin at 9AM and will be held at the Clarence White Memorial Family Life Center in Bonham. If you voted in the Republican Party Primary, you are officially affiliated with the Republican Party and eligible to participate in your precinct convention, propose resolutions, and be selected as a delegate to the county—and potentially state—convention. The State Republican Party Convention will be held June 10–13 in Houston, where party legislative priorities, platform resolutions, and leadership direction are considered statewide. Conventions are where committed Republicans turn votes into action, so we encourage everyone who participated in the primary to get involved and make their voice heard.

Republican Ballot Propositions

Republican voters will find ten propositions on the primary ballot for the March 3rd election. In a Texas party primary election, ballot propositions are non-binding “yes” or “no” statements placed on the ballot by a political party for its primary voters to express their views on key issues. They do not create or change state law. These propositions simply act as an opinion poll to show what Republican primary voters support and help guide party priorities, platform planks, and legislative focus in the coming session.

County Candidate Forum



The Fannin County Republican Party County Candidate Forum was held on Saturday, January 31st at the Roy Floyd Community Center (Armory) with over 200 residents in attendance to hear from and meet candidates to ask questions. This type of event would not be possible without the dedicated efforts of your Republican Precinct Chairs to help set-up, tear-down, make the coffee, and be great hosts.

We received both positive and negative feedback. We are always interested in improvement and ways to better serve and inform our Republican voters. The biggest criticism was that there were no questions during the event taken from those in attendance. While that is a noble idea, that was not the purpose of this event. This was a Candidate Forum, for the public to hear from the candidates and not a Public Forum for the candidates to hear from the public. There was time before the Forum and after the Forum for anyone interested in asking questions of candidates to do so, and many took advantage of this opportunity. From a practical perspective it simply is not possible to offer this public questioning fairly to all public participants without making this event last a full day or more rather than a lengthy 3 hours. With the number of candidates participating, providing even a minimal amount of time for responses to a limited number of questions (four in this case) required slightly more than the full 3 hours.

We will continue to provide fair and well-organized opportunities for voters to meet and be informed about candidates in our Republican elections to the best of our abilities.
